This year we are thrilled to welcome back familiar faces with our speakers who will explore Nicene trinitarianism and its enduring legacy!



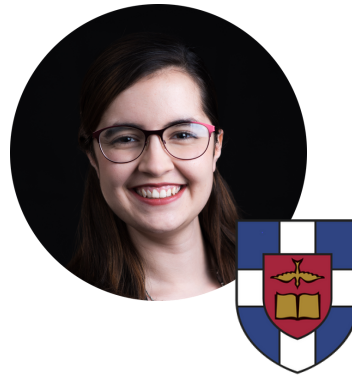

New Publications

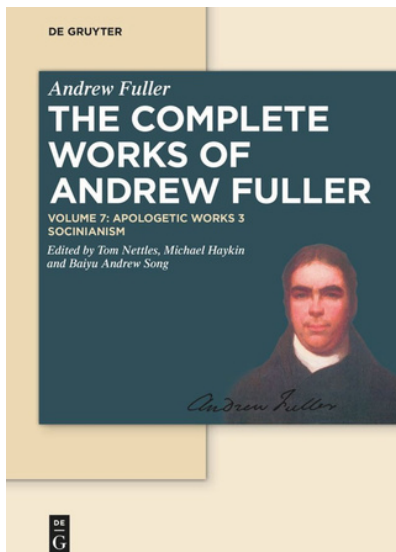
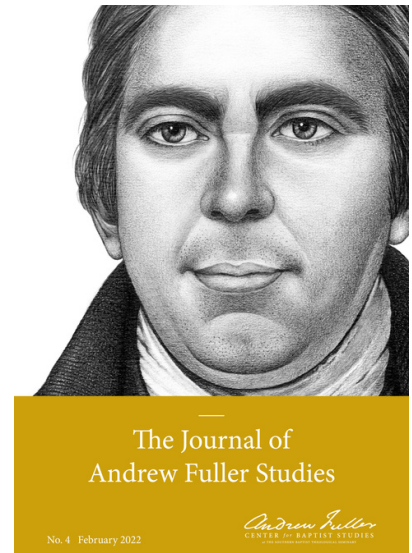
